




What is Life Cycle Cost?

The real cost of a flooring must include purchase, installation, cleaning and maintenance during the whole life cycle of the product. Aspects like collection of post installation waste, recycling and disposal should also be considered. The Life Cycle Cost software (LCC) is a program developed by Tarkett that integrates all these parameters and assesses the true cost of the flooring over its entire life cycle.

How can it be minimised?

When Tarkett's floorcoverings – made of high-quality raw materials and with outstanding PUR reinforcement and Unique Surface Restoration – are chosen, the LCC has proved that the cost of cleaning and maintenance is significantly reduced.

The 8/92 concept



Tarkett's LCC program has proven that over a 20-year period, cleaning and maintenance represent on average 92% of the flooring's total cost, which leaves a lot of room for substantial savings. Purchase and installation only account for 8%, so the purchase price can have no more than a minor effect on the life cycle cost.

Since 1999, we have reduces our total organic emission, by up to 50%, cut our water consumption and our non-recycled waste by no less that 30%. 



Twice yearly with combined machine and red pad at medium speed 400 rpm. Alkaline detergent (pH 8-10). Clear water rinse. Final damp sweep.

Regulation and norms: Moderate to heavy commercial

Requirements: Slip resistance, impervious (walls and floors), comfort underfoot, easy to clean and maintain

Safety flooring maintenance



Daily maintenance

Sweep and spot with neutral detergent, clean with a brush and neutral detergent (pH 7-8). Remove marks with a medium grade fibre pad and undiluted detergent.



Periodic maintenance

Machine with brushes and neutral detergent. Clean the brushes regularly. Remove marks with medium grade fibre pad and undiluted detergent. Scrubber dryer with green pad or rotary/cylindrical machine with a brush. Polish should never be applied, because it will affect the slip resistant properties.





Netroom

Manual cleaning – brush with alkaline detergent (pH 11-12). Rinse well with clear water.

Retirement and assisted living homes

THE COLOUR, TEXTURE and design of floorcoverings directly contribute to the comfort and well-being of elderly residents by making them feel welcome and at home. But the best choices for a bed sitting room and a physiotherapy room have little else in common. With elderly and dependent patients, whose conditions may be aggravated by senile dementia or Alzheimer's disease, the need to consider such requirements is even greater.

Flooring that contributes to well-being

Retirement and assisted living facilities are responding to the challenge of keeping residents active and ablebodied, stimulating them and helping them develop their feelings and emotional responses as they arise. The aim is to maintain the maximum of their abilities for perception and physical fitness.

- > Colours and designs can be put to use in corridors and open areas where lighter shades can suggest the right direction, or in prohibited zones where a sharp contrast can discourage entry. Warm, clean and bright colours can also be applied to help offset feelings of anxiety by creating a more reassuring environment.
- > The need for safety and good function is extensive. Safety flooring in relevant areas can avoid slip and fall injuries, and flooring in all areas must provide stability, comfort and allow rolling of equipment and wheel chairs.

RETIREMENT AND ASSISTED LIVING HOMES



Flooring can contribute to greater well-being and act as a stimulus to patients

- > Managing circulation and walking around

- Facilitating access from one area to another with subtle transitions

Retirement and assisted living facilities:

Heavy traffic and general areas

ENTRANCE, RECEPTION, HALLWAYS, STAIRS AND LIFT ACCESS

In these heavy traffic areas, the flooring must have a great resistance to wear and tear, and be very easy to clean and maintain. The use of colour and design could be more neutral, and provide useful information and facilitate way finding.

LOUNGE, DINING AND STAFF AREAS

In these spaces, people should really be able to relax. They are quite often located within a larger, open plan area and it is therefore vital to define smaller, more intimate parts of the bigger area. We recommend working with indirect lighting and enclosing the space by the use of brighter and darker colours, warmly tinted woodwork, soft patinas, natural materials and discreet patterns.

Retirement and assisted living facilities:

Wet rooms, private areas and functional areas

In these areas it is important to create a sense of safety, cleanliness and well-being by using floorcoverings that are attractive, practical and hygienic. Navy blue, sky blue, almond green, ochre or beige are the preferred colours. Choose a darker shade for greater contrast with fittings and walls.

As a more private area the bedroom is a very intimate space, where residents can create an environment they feel at home in. Here we want to create a warm and natural atmosphere, using materials that evoke nature, inclu-

ding wood and soft patinas. Soft and subtle designs are also used, with medium to bright colours in tones of terra cotta, ochre, plum and warm to very warm wood essences. To allow space for personal style, more neutral colours can be chosen, for example a background of discreet pastel designs.

FUNCTIONAL AREAS

In areas for daily handling of functional issues, like kitchen, rooms for taking care of soiled utilities etc, the demands for resistance and infection control is extensive. It is also crucial that the flooring is easy to clean and maintain and provide great resistance to chemicals, stains and slipperiness.







Example of typical German colour sheme






Example of typical Scandinavian colour sheme




Example of typical Southern European colour sheme




Example of typical home environment colour sheme
